11 *All About the Questions*

Take time to ask yourself these questions and be prepared to answer them as well. Go through the PDF's and highlight the ones that are the most important to you before the interview process. One valuable lesson we have learned is to include the entire team in the interview process. You will be working with everyone in the salon daily. If you all agree to bring on a new member of the team, you all take ownership in helping them launch and be a good team player.

12 *Get to Know the Salon you are Interviewing*

Creep the salon, stylist, and employees. Get to know the salon and everyone in it before the interview.

13 *Preparing for the Second Interview*

Always be prepared. If you don't have the proper tools, be forthright and reschedule the interview.

14 *Be Prepared for the Second Interview*

Double check your PDF checklist and kit before you leave for the interview.

15 *Choosing Your Model*

Don't be late. Arrive with your model 30 minutes ahead of time. This will allow you to set up and settle your nerves. Don't, meet your model there, ride together. Don't take a chance on them being late and effecting your outcome. Relax you can do this!

16 *How to Handle the Basics*

Have a conversation with your model about what they will be looking for during the interview. With you both being on the same page you should have a great chance at landing the job you desire, and jump starting your career.

17 *You Only Get One Shot*

I am a sucker for the underdog story. I have been there. Starting out, 17 years old, zero experience and zero collage education, and I made it, so can you. You only get one shot don't miss your chance to seize everything you ever wanted.
